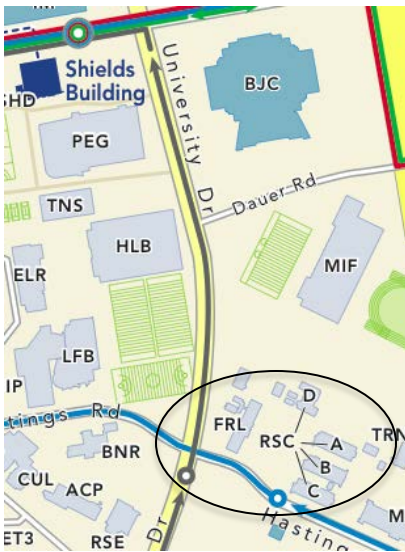
Department Head Update – January 2015

Greetings from the Department of Agricultural and Biological Engineering! Fall semester has come and gone, and Spring semester has just begun. There is much to share as we start the new year.

Building project

It is hard to believe how quickly the project is moving along. We spent the Fall working on two primary goals – identifying the team that will do the project, and finding a temporary home for the department while the construction is underway.



Our temporary home is referred to as “swing space”. We believe we have this part of the project all worked out – we will be moving to the Northeast side of University Drive, into the Forestry Research Lab (FRL), “Research Unit A” RSC-A, and a new modular lab that has been built in between these two buildings (see the map). “BJC” is the Bryce Jordan Center, “PEG” is the Pegula Ice Arena.

We have completed the second goal, identifying the team that will do the project. We started with 18 team proposals and narrowed it down to the final three. The final selection was on January 15.

Although it seems like an ambitious schedule, we anticipate moving out in early Summer 2016, and moving back in by January 2018. Only three years to go!

In the very near future, all alums in our database will receive a post card announcing the project and the campaign to procure additional funds so that we can achieve our goals.
