❖ "non-typical" manure export situations:

- Manure exported for use in making compost
- Manure exported to landfills
- Manure exported to another farm for use as bedding.
- Manure exported for use in making energy
- Manure exported using the open market system
- Manure exported using manure auctions

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What & Who

❖ Normally dry / stackable manure

- Heavy on bedding or litter
- Low % moisture
- Mostly poultry & equine
- Most often all-export farms, with little to no crops or pasture

❖ Generally 2 groups of importers

- Those whose main concern is material volume
- Those whose main concern is nutrient content

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Those whose main concern is material volume

❖ Importer primarily wants / is willing to take the material

❖ Importer has little to no need for knowing analysis

- Manure used in making compost
 - ✓ Mushroom growers
 - ✓ Mulch and landscaping businesses
- Manure accepted at landfill
- Manure dried and used as bedding
- Manure used for making energy
 - ✓ Incinerators / burners

 - ✓ Need Signed Agreements (***but not NBSs***)
 - *Manure used for other than Ag land application*
 - ✓ Haulers / brokers still need to be Act 49 cert.
 - ✓ NMP must include:
 - Description of how exported manure will be managed
 - Importer's name & site address
 - Estimated amount & intended season

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Those whose main concern is nutrients

- ❖ Importer wants the nutrients
- ❖ Importer interested in analysis as much as volume
 - Manure Auctions
 - Manure dried, bagged, and sold @ retail outlets
 - Possibly manure exported through an open market
 - Manure digestors

- NM Tech Manual / App. 8 / Scenario 5
 - ✓ Exporter must be Act 49 broker certified
 - ✓ NBSs (*but not Signed Agreements*) needed for importer for Auctions & Open Market situations (those larger than small-quantity)
 - ✓ Signed Agreements (*but not NBSs*) needed with retailer for retail
 - ✓ Field application setbacks apply to Ag land application

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Nutrients continued.....

- Exporter's NMP must include:
 - ✓ Estimated amounts
 - ✓ Proposed marketing scheme:
 - Form of product
 - Perspective markets
 - General region material to be marketed
 - Planned advertisement system

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Required Records

❖ Manure generated

- tons, gallons, cu. ft.

❖ Manure export records

- Manure Export Sheet
- Manure Transfer Summary Sheet is optional
 - ✓ Exporter may use an Excel spreadsheet

❖ Manure analysis only needed when

- Land applied (auctions & open markets)
- Packaged and sold through retail (*PDA requirement*)
